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Working Conditions

Conditions of Service For international Volunteers

Adequate working conditions are needed to enable over-seas volunteers to take up their tasks in a safe and healthy environment; to ensure their well-being and motivation, as well as adequate development of prevention, protection and assistance actions for the local community, that are being impacted by the work of the host organisation.

Both sending and hosting organisations must work together to ensure that the proposed working conditions, comply with the agreed procedures relating to protection, health and security

Working conditions for overseas Volunteers:

Length of service	The length of deployment is specific to each project. It ranges from 1 month to 18 month.

Risk prevention actions related to safety, health and security are to be set in place for the volunteer, including: availability to health care, vehicle maintenance, actions to prevent frequent diseases in the area and other detected risks, maintenance of premisesSafety, health and security
