

Migrants InterculturalMalta in Europe and Malta

Third-country nationals (TCNs): "Migrants coming from countries outside the EU and not holding the citizenship of an EU country. This group includes both persons born in a country outside the EU and persons born in the EU but not holding the citizenship of an EU Member State"

EU-27 in 2010:

- Total population 501.1 million
- Non-nationals 32.5 million (6.5%)
 - Non-EU (TCNs) 20.2 million (4%)
 - Migrants from within EU-27 12.3 million (2.5%)

Malta in 2010:

- Total population 413,000
- Non-nationals 16,700 (4%)
 - Non-EU (TCNs) 11,300 (2.7%)
 - Migrants from other EU member states 5,400 (1.3%)

- 53% Economic situation
- 36% Unemployment
- 32% The state of public finances
- 16% Rising prices/inflation
- 8% Immigration
- 7% EU's influence in the world

Malta

- 51% Economic situation
- 35% The state of public finances
- 24% Unemployment
- 19% Immigration
- 10% Rising prices/inflation
- 5% Crime

Discrimination InterculturalMalta in Europe and Malta

EU – 27

- In 2012 overall discrimination is believed to be widespread, particularly on the grounds of ethnic origin. (56%, down from 61% in May 2009).
- Gender (45%); Sexual orientation (46%); Religion or belief (39%); Disability (46%)

Malta


- Discrimination on grounds of ethnic origin is perceived as being the most widespread form of discrimination in Malta – 53%
- Gender (51%); Sexual orientation (54%); Religion or belief (26%); Disability (23%)
